Prior Experience

Representative Matters

- Successfully represented three defendants in a Massachusetts trade secrets case who were dismissed for lack of personal jurisdiction. The court found that the plaintiff's jurisdictional allegations failed to satisfy both the Massachusetts Long-Arm Statute and constitutional

due process requirements.

- Successful client representation in numerous contract, business, shareholder and partnership disputes involving financial institutions; insurance agencies; real estate and investment companies; construction trades; product manufacturers; and technology companies.
- Obtained multi-million dollar judgment on behalf of four plaintiffs in a federal case involving fraudulent investment solicitation and violations of the RICO Act.

This result minimized client exposure and avoided the significant costs typically associated with class action litigation.
